Thanks for listening!

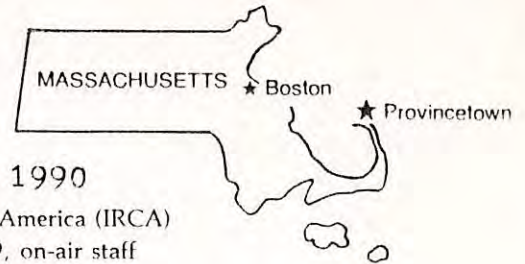

- 10:06 - Time given, then the weather report with Dave Santoro, meteorologist, speaking on a phone patch.
- 10:08 - Sports news - said Bruins' game would be on WNCG tonight at 8, and the Patriots on Sunday at 12:15, with kickoff at 1 p.m. Then on came deejay Mark Allred.
- 10:14 - Plug for high school sports event on WNCG on January 3rd.
- 10:14:30 - Talking about cancer treatment by a conservative and a liberal - I think the former was Goldwater, and the second, Jesse Jackson. Gave out a phone number: 1-800-255-1000.

Hope this will show I did have WNCG tuned in, on my Hammarlund HQ-150. There was no background interference at all, but at night - wow! Oops - I have more notes on this reception:

- 10:16 - Said the stocks at the opening were a bit down. Prediction of sluggish economic activity next year, by Dick Liriano, and then back to Mark Allred.
- 10:21:30 - Talking about back pain and Ainsbury Hospital Back and Neck Clinic, 9:15 to 11 a.m. Thursdays - call 388-5060, ext. 116.

I am retired, and now am a volunteer deejay for WOMR-91.9 here in Provincetown. I have two hours Saturday mornings, with an hour each for concert-in-the-park type band music, and an hour of all marches. I also am the Monday host for our daily concert hall four-hour afternoon show. I do my own engineering and boardwork, so it shows, you CAN teach an old dog (old goat?) new tricks!
