

Gentlemen - Good Morning!

Please excuse my lack of knowledge of the Spanish language, but I was tuned to WNNW here this late afternoon, and this is the first time I've been able to raise WNNW here at the Tip of the Cape. All day, I get WHIM in East Providence, and at night, WBT takes over the channel. Twilight time brings a mixture of several stations, including CKTY in Orillia, Ontario. But today, strange conditions prevailed, and I found WNNW rolling in here with a good strong signal, with only slight interference from what I presume was WBT. I hope I can convince you I had WNNW, even though, as I said above, I am not conversant in Spanish. Here are my notes on your programming:

Date: Saturday, November 13, 1993

Frequency - 1110 kHz.

- 5:08 p.m. (as I tuned in) I heard mention of Santo Domingo (pace?) (It sounded like PAH-KAY) about three times during this announcement. A phone number, apparently, was given.
- 5:08:45 - Male vocal, in Spanish.
- 5:11 - Another announcement in Spanish; then more Latin-American music.
- 5:16 - Again an announcement referred to Santo Domingo Pachay, or similar. Also mentioned "Numero Uno," and "New Hampshire."
- 5:18 - I heard mention of Nashua, New Hampshire, and Lawrence.
- 5:19:30 - Female vocal, in Spanish.
- 5:22 - Male vocal, with guitar accompaniment.
- 5:25 - Announcement, mentioning "Antonio" and "Tony Garcia."
- 5:28 - Mentioned "La Madrugada."
- 5:29 - Gave a telephone number twice. I managed to catch the last three digits:486.
- 5:30:30 - In English first, then Spanish: "WNNW, 1110, Salem." Then, I received my call to supper, thus ending my reception of WNNW.

I do hope this is of some interest to you, Pat - I tried to hear your special test broadcast on last February 15th, to no avail - too much WBT and CKTY, plus TV whistle-like interference killed your test here.

The receiver is an 18 tube 1963 Hammarlund HQ-180, with an indoor ferrite rod tuned loop, on a spindle - the Space Magnet II, or more simply, the SM-2.

I enclose a pamphlet explaining our hobby of DXing, and of verifying, and I do hope it will be of some interest to you. And I look forward to hearing from you, verifying my reception of SNNW, and please include a coverage map, if one is available, and also, please let me know how much power you were running at the above time. What are your on-air hours?

Thank you - muchas gracias - for your trouble and kindness, Pat, and the very best of continued success to you and WNNW!
