Reference is made to your letter dated November 6, 1948, in which you reported hearing this station in Brooklyn between 4:28:30 p.m. and 4:43:30 p.m. The times and programs listed in your letter as checked against our program log for that date were found to be correct.

Regarding your suggestion of this station putting on a DX program and calling it equipment testing would be of only academic interest to us. We are not particularly interested in how far we get out during the early morning hours when we would not normally be on the air. I know from past experience that a DX program between Midnight and 6:00 a.m. is not a true indication of a broadcast station's service area. We are only interested in the size of the area we service during our normal broadcast day under average conditions of QRN and QRM.
