Very glad to hear from you again, and to get your report of the reception of our signals during our DX broadcast of 2 February 1948.

Your logging agrees quite accurately with our program log, and it therefore gives me pleasure to verify your report of reception.

I am a little dissappointed though, for you did not get in early enough to hear your own dedication, which was the first number on our program.

The reports have been swell, and covered the greater part of the states from Indiana to Maryland, Maine and New Hampshire excepted to date. Hi. They are still dwindling in tho, and we may yet find that we covered our own dooryard.

Our frequency check in now on a monthly basis, and takes place between 0500 and 0515 on the third Monday of each month,- 16th February being next. Would not care to change this at this time.

I like your selection of receiver,- the HQ-129X and think that you will get plenty of DX with it. Here is hoping, anyway. I might mention in regards to our frequency check, that RCAC apparently gets us in the first 2 or 3 minutes of checking, this no doubt due to the directional effect of their antenna, but just to indicate that reception at that distance is quite possible.
