Dear sir;

This will acknowledge your letter of the 26th in which you quote several entries in your log between the hours of 11:59 P of July 25 and 12:02 A July 26, and it gives me pleasure to assure you that this all checks with our program log of the above time, thus confirming your reception of WFAU. Congratulations!!

Without question you have a very efficient receiver, accounting in part for your great number of DX verifications, but I believe that the real secret of your success in logging the many stations that you have is the personal element,- a great determination and much greater patience.

We have several owners of SCOTT receivers in this area, but, to the best of my knowledge, only one of these has ever done much dx-ing. This was several years ago and during his time here,- he later moved to Pennsylvania,- he had logged a tremendous number of broadcast stations in this country, but his hobby at that time was foreign stations on the BC frequencies, of which he picked up a great many.

As regards frequency checks, we are still in that large group that are operating without frequency monitor. It therefore is necessary for us to obtain a weekly check. This is done by telephone, and therefore we seldom use any programming, but occasionally a tone. At present this is taken at 0500 Mondays. This is subject to change at any time.

I want to thank you for your fine report, and also for the invitation to put on a "DX" program, concerning which you may hear from us later, and to wish you the best of success in your "DX".
