and I shall attempt to answer your questions.


Yes, I started in radio (announcer) at W C S H,
Portland in early-1937 as DX broadcaster. Started
working for 'CSH in November, 1937. Have been in
radio-tv (uhf) ever since then.

I am sorry but we do not have any coverage maps
on "Katie-Q". We're 3 years old...have no regional
or national rep. We had a bunch photo-stated when
we started but they were not very professional and
haven't made any new ones. The significance of call
letters is to establish station as a personality by
name as well as performance. People refer to us as
"Katie-Q". JoKester said "...not Kings Top Queens?"

Our early AM check period is 1m cycle tone only
2nd Tuesday every-~~other~~ month. Next check 12:05AM
early Wed Feb 11. Checked by Cambridge Thermionic.

Have application with FCC for 1380 Kc, 1 Kw, D, in
Farmington, Maine. Now 60th in processing line. Per-
haps we can try from there some day!
