On behalf of WYNZ Chief Engineer Ronald Malone, I wish to thank you very much for your fascinatingly detailed AM-FM reception reports dated June 19, 1981. This letter verifies reception of our AM signal on June 18 and 19, 1981, and of our FM signal on June 18, 1981, all at times indicated. Please forgive the excessively lengthy delay in responding. (The "female announcer" you heard during the very early morning hours was Anne Michaud, our then-overnight personality, who has since left us; the air person you heard between 10:47 and 11:10:30 a.m. on June 19 was most likely morning man Bob Anderson.)


WYNZ transmits 24 hours a day with 5-kw (daytime nondirectional, nighttime directional); our live personality format employs the increasingly-popular syndicated taped "Music of Your Life" service. This is augmented with CBS Radio affiliation, our own superb four-person local news department, and our status as Greater Portland's outlet station for the Boston Red Sox, Boston Celtics, Boston Bruins, and New England Patriots.

Since you wrote your letter, we've changed the format of our co-owned sister FM station, WYNZ-FM (100.9 MHz; 3-kw ERP), from live personality "hard rock" to a semi-automated soft adult rock sound; our new nickname for it is "Y101". Both stations have had tremendous impact in this market in the past year, much to the delight of many folks.

As you imply, we know for a fact that we have many regular listeners on the Cape, such as yourself. We're deeply gratified to know that our signal reaches down there and that so many enjoy our unique sound. It's always a pleasure to communicate with a friend down in Eugene O'Neill's old stamping ground and Andre<sup>®</sup> the Seal's launching pad. I've enclosed a YNZ Club application form for you.

Again, please excuse the reply delay. Thanks for writing, and we hope you and your friends will tune us in again to enjoy the "Music of Your Life".
