
Dear Mr. Cooper:

I am indeed pleased to verify your reception of WJCO on the morning of February 4, 1963 while I was conducting equipment test and a frequency check. The information which you included to establish this rather weak signal in your area is correct, according to our transmitter log.

In answer to several of your questions that you included in your letter, yes, WJCO is directional. I find it quite interesting that you were even able to pick us up in the Brooklyn area as you lay just off from one of our minor lobes in our directional pattern. Our pattern generally runs north/northwest and our major lobe is essentially to the north of Jackson, Michigan. I am taking the opportunity to include an advertising brochure which does show our coverage map, and you can determine from this our directionalize pattern. Our next equipment test for frequency check purposes will be conducted on Monday, 1:30 A.M., on March 4, and our established pattern is that we use the first Monday morning of each month to establish a frequency check. Since we are a daytime operating station, on directional pattern, we operate from local sunrise to local sunset, this means that during the month of February, we sign on the air at 7:30 A.M. Eastern Standard Time and must sign off at 6:15 P.M. Eastern Standard Time.

May I wish you continued success in your DXing. Thank you so much for submitting your report to me as I found it of great interest.
