Dear Mr. Cooper:

Thank you for your letter under date of July 26, 1947 reporting reception of WPAG between 1:09-1:11 AM on that date. Your report is entirely correct.

The program which you heard happened to be an audition that was being conducted at our studio. At the time I was checking our transmitter and therefore used the program to test with. The time after one am is designated as experimental hours and therefore this broadcast was entirely legal. However, this time is designated for experimental use and not for conducting DX programs.

Thank you for your report and interest in our station. We do not have any regularly scheduled test programs or frequency check broadcast. In most instances our testing consists of mainly adjusting the transmitter using a audio oscillator and then a station identification prior to sign off.
