Dear Mr. Cooper

I was very glad to receive your letter reporting on our broadcasts the morning of November 6. In answer to your questions KMMO is a daytime station operating between local sunrise and sunset. However being on a regional frequency we have permission to go on the air anytime after four AM. but are still limited to local sunset for sign off. Our present broadcast day is from 6 A.M. to 5 P.M. December is our shortest broadcast month, the sign off time being 4:45 P.M. all times CST. We cover approximately 80 miles around us solid and further under certain conditions. KMMO's frequency is checked by the Commercial Radio Monitoring Co. of Kansas City at 2:30 PM the last Friday of every month. We very seldom go on during the experimental period for frequency checks. We have applications in for an increase in power to 1,000 Watts so maybe you can pick us up better then.

I find by checking our logs that you definitely heard our broadcast and it is verified by this letter. Hope to hear from you again sometime and wish you the best of luck and good DXing.
