Dear Mr. Cooper:

Thank you for your report of reception of WCNC on December 28, 1939. It is correct.

We are using a Western Electric 310-B transmitter, 23-B speech console, Collins limiting amplifier, RCA turntables and Saltshaker Microphones. Our antenna is a Blaw-Knox, one hundred seventy five feet high. At present we are on the air from six in the morning until ten at night. So far the commission has not assigned us a frequency checking period, but as soon as it is assigned I will notify the headquarters of your club.
