Thanks for your letter of the 12th reporting reception of test of October 10, which report is of course correct.

Reply was delayed to determine just how careful we would have to be in handling such. However, we find that after 4 a.m. we have the same leeway of operation that we would have during regular program hours, in fact a bit more so if there is any difference.

Sunday November 21, 4:00-5:00 a.m. is entirely agreeable with us for a special test dedicated especially to N.R.C. members. We will also be glad to make such announcements as you wish plugging DX NEWS.

The condition is so general that mention hardly need be made that we have our own manpower problems, since one announcer left three weeks ago, I have had to take a three hour mike shift in the general dividing up of his trick. Nothing novel or new about that since I had to do all the installation of our plant. I've had a commercial ticket since 1926 and of course now that is rated as First Class Radiotelephone. Some couple of months ago managed to find a good operator with a First Class ticket, then we have made Restricted Permittes out of three others here. Personally, I held a ham call (4DV) in 1916 and after the first World War was given the first 4th District call issued, ~~W4AA~~ and have held that ever since, except for its present war-time suspension.

I will probably run the test myself and any dope you would like to pass along for use, we will be glad to have.
