Our monitor is in Winston Salem, N.C., therefore it would not matter if we changed our checking time or not. He doesn't have too many availabilities.

Our regular checking period has been changed to the first Wednesday of each month from 4:30-4:45 am. I wish you would publish this in the Club paper.

Fayetteville got its name from the French general LaFayette. Being from Providence, Rhode Island, I don't much care! We service Fayetteville and Fort Bragg day and night, and the fort has a population of about 150,000. Fayetteville itself has about 43,000. Our regular schedule is from 600-1:05 am. We are CBS in town.

The call letters were changed when the company bought WWNF because of an unsavory reputation! We took over last April, and have stations in Georgetown, Del. and Radford, Va. WJWL and WRAD.
