Attention of the Program Director
and/or the Chief Engineer

Gentlemen - Good Morning!

This early evening, I chanced to come across your brand new station here at the tip of Cape Cod! I hadn't known it was on the air, and so it came as a total surprise to me to pick up WMYT here today. I hope you will be interested in knowing your signal can get out this far as it gets dark, and I also hope you will be so kind as to verify my reception of WMYK, if these notes below prove to you I did indeed hear your station.

Date: Friday, February 2, 1990

Frequency - 1180 kHz.

- 5:40 p.m. - The signal faded in as I was trying to ID a station playing old-time dance music, with a man singing "It's a Wonderful Day", or rather, a male quartet.
- 5:42:30 - Male vocal, gospel song. (Here, the signal faded out for a few minutes).
- 5:47 - The signal re-appeared, with a lady singing a gospel song with a vocal group behind her.
- 5:50 - A few words of Praise, spoken over music, and into a male vocal.
- 5:53 - Man began to speak, mentioning the First Pentecostal Holiness Church, at 29th and Chestnut Streets, -----, North Carolina. He mentioned the date, and talked of being Born Again and invited listeners not affiliated with a church to worship with us. He quoted various Bible verses and mentioned "The New Birth." He said he had been saved at Age 13. He gave the times of services at the church: Sunday School at 9:45; 10:50, and 7 p.m., and Wednesdays at 7:30, and again invited listeners to attend.
- 6:00 - Male vocal, "I Believe", soon cut for the sign-off announcement which was very brief, mentioning the call letters WMYT, Carolina Beach - Wilmington, ---" a few more words, and off the air abruptly at 6:01 p.m. without mentioning sign-on time tomorrow.

The signal was growing louder as it got later, and the station with the old music did not re-appear - I suspect it was WMRE in Knoxville. I had my indoor tuned ferrite loop antenna turned into a null position on WHAM in Rochester, NY, a station which doesn't come in too well here anyhow, and they were hardly noticable as I listened as above, on my Hammarlund HQ-180 18-tube receiver.

I hope you will be so kind as to send me a letter, verifying my reception of WMYT, to go with my 194 other North Carolina AM stations verified since I began this great hobby of DXing in 1932. My overall total is 4,350, from 82 countries. I now also tune FM and have 563 FM verifications, of which ten are from NC. I am retired, and am kept busy as a volunteer deejay with local non-commercial community access FMer WOMR-91.9, being a classical music host of a four-hour concert on Monday afternoons, and steward of a two-hour band music program on Saturday mornings - an hour of concert band music, and an hour of all marches. I hope WMYT will be a great success, and it was a thrill to pick you up way up here on this cold night just as our all-day rain was changing into snow! Return postage is enclosed.
