Dear Mr. Cooper:

Thank you for your report-of-reception of WOBR in Brooklyn.
We verify operation at the times indicated.

We were operating 29-30 September beyond our daytime hours under the provisions of FCC Article 73.98 because of the approach of hurricane GINGER. Fortunately for us, GINGER veered to the South and went inland about 75 miles away but managed to dump 11-inches of rain on us in the two-day period.... $8\frac{1}{2}$ inches in eight hours. Our winds got up to only 50-MPH, about 35 miles to the South at Cape Hatteras they clocked 74-MPH winds and a little further South at 90-MPH.

We normally get a frequency check around 12:30-1:00 a.m., EDT on a Monday morning after WCKY goes off the air. I will make an effort to schedule it at 4:00 a.m., EST on December 20th as requested. A reminder from you a few days before that time might serve to jog our memory. However, I am marking the calendar for that date.
