This letter confirms your reception of WPXY Radio on Sunday, March 14, 1965, from 6:16:15a.m. Eastern Standard Time, to 6:32:15. Comparing your reception report with our program log, we find them to correlate.

I am always most pleased to get a DX report such as yours that is so well put together. It is a shame that so many SWL's and Broadcast Band DX'ers just can't seem to understand that certain facts are necessary before they can receive confirmation from the station received. You'd be amazed at how many reports we receive with no times, no date, or even more unbelievable, no program content. Keep up your good work.

I have enclosed a coverage map with this letter. I might also note that our antenna is a "folden unipole" type, which is, in effect, an inverted folded dipole. This gives us a longer effective antenna length than would normally be used for 1550kc. Speaking of antennae, your old-timer's loop fascinates me. Obviously you've been in this for a long time; I'm sure you agree with me, also an old-timer, that the older type antennae like yours with "lots of wire" are really better!

I'm a "ham" operator, W4FPQ, and also chief engineer for WPXY. I wonder if you are in commercial radio. Let me hear from you.
