Dear Mr. Greene,

One of the members of our National Radio Club reported having received a verification letter from WSRC signed by you, and since my earlier report to WSRC did not produce the hoped-for verification, I am taking the liberty of re-submitting that report to your attention. Return postage was enclosed with my letter, dated October 12, 1954.

Date: October 12, 1955

Frequency - 1410 kc/s.

1:17 a.m., E.S.T. - Station identification made, and announcer explained that this was an equipment test. The studio location was also given.

1:21 - "Hey There," male vocal.

1:23:35 - Selection, no preceeding announcement.

1:26:45 - Announcement of calls, location, and test.

1:43 - Announcer explained that WSRC will take the air on ----- at 5 a.m. with some of the best entertainment. Said station will operate daily from 5 a.m. until sunset on the 1410 spot on your dial. The announcement closed with, "WSRC, in Durham, North Carolina."

WSRC was underneath all-night station WING here, fading up and down, but never quite equalling the powerful signal from Dayton. They were S-9 and very steady, while you swung from S-5 to S-8, fading considerably. The receiver is an 11-tube 1947 Hammarlund HQ-129-X, and the antenna used was a 50' long, 50' high NW-SE inverted L, with lead-in taken from the NW end.

Please, Mr. Greene, do me the favor of verifying my reception of your station, and using the word "VERIFIED" in mentioning it. Also, please tell me when WSRC began regular schedule, and what your on-the-air hours are currently. Do you make early-morning frequency checks? Is there any significance to your call letters? Are you affiliated with any other station?

Thank you very much, in advance of your favor, Mr. Greene, and the very best to you and to all the folks at WSRC.
