Many thanks for your DX letter of the 3rd.

WVOB went on the air June 11th. We have almost all brand-new equipment, almost all of it by Gates, with the exception of our transmitter, which is an RCA. I'm pleased to say that our signal is much stronger than we had hoped, and I have received DX letters from all over the Mid-Atlantic states.

We don't broadcast for frequency checks in the middle of the night, since our checks come from a frequency measuring service in Baltimore, which is only 25 miles away, and where we have a strong signal, which can be easily measured during our regular broadcast hours.
