I have your letter stating that you heard Station KFOR on February 17th, at 12:29 $\frac{1}{2}$, operating on a frequency of 1210 kcs. Please accept this letter as verification of your reception.

I might say that KFOR generally leaves the air at midnight, CST., but that night we broadcast an extra hour due to local news of interest, which involved the escape of four convicts from the reformatory. Their capture was expected at any moment.

KFOR's power is only 100 watts at night, so it is a little unusual that you should be able to hear it, at your location. However, I am very glad to have your letter, and wish to thank you for it and for your interest.
