Dear Ernie:

Congratulations! This letter is to confirm or OSL your reception and logging of WERA on Fri, March 19, from 12:05 until 12:20 am EST.

WERA is a 500 watt, directional antennae, daytime only station, with studio's and offices located in the Park Hotel Annex, Plainfield; and transmitter at 310 Oak Tree Ave, South Plainfield, N.J.

We transmit a figure eight pattern in a North- South direction, using three 140 ft in line towers. Our Transmitters are RCA type BTA-1R, 1000 watt units operated at half power. The station broadcasts from 6:00 am until local sundown seven days a week. We began operation in Sept, 1961.

We thank your for your interest and comments. (Beleive me, if we could get nights or more power we would, but all the stations you mentioned as hearing are exactly the reason. If you can hear them here, they would hear us there. The rules are quite specific: No station will be permitted to cause any interference with any other prior existing facility. As we are sort of new, or jonny-come-lately, we are hemmed in and frozen.)

If you are ever out our way, and would like to see our installation, you may drop in anytime during normal programming hours. We would enjoy talking with you. Again, Congratulations. (Ah! perserverence.)
