Dear Mr. Cooper;

This is to confirm your reception of WAPC AM on August 22, 1963. We have only been AM since the eighth of August. We use a Collins 20V-2 transmitter with a two tower directional antenna, beamed toward the East, due to WQXR and our sister station, WPAC in Patchogue.

Your information was basically correct, except that WAPC FM is on 103.9 mc. WAPC FM broadcasts from 0600 until 2300, and after AM signoff broadcasts in stereo-multiplex.

Yours is the fourth report of reception we have received. One from your friend Ron Schiller in Monmouth Beach, one from Freehold N.J. and one from Bradford, Mass. We supposedly go to Connecticut, but so far we haven't heard from anyone up that way. If you have any fellow DX'ers in Connecticut we'd appreciate hearing from them.

This station does not have a chief engineer as such, since most of the engineering is taken care of by the chief of WPAC. There are two engineers here, of which I am one, but I usually leave the verifications to the other engineer. Your little DX booklet caught my eye, along with your Brooklyn address. My address is 2436 East 23 St. which makes us almost neighbors.

Enclosed is a coverage map for WAPC and WPAC. Thank you for letter, and I hope to hear from you again.
