Thankyou for your nice letter on the reception of WBRV on July 25, 1955.

Our transmitter log shows that our carrier went on the air on July 25th at 2:47 EDST and went off the air at 3:10 AM. At the time the carrier went on a brief announcement was made giving ID. During the entire test there was no tone on at all. I believe that you must of had another station behind us which had a carrier on with tone. Our test period was for the express purpose of making a frequency check with RCA Riverhead, New York. Your report for July 27th is correct. The carrier went on at 2:54 and left the air at 3:03 AM EDST, But ~~there~~ there was an announcement giving an ID.

This letter will confirm your reception of WBRV on both dates. Your questions concerning our location, population and Etc. is as follows:

Boonville is located in the Black River Basin 25 miles northeast of Rome, New York. The population is about 2500. Our popwer is 500 watts daytime, non-directional. The town of Boonville was named after a man called Boon in the 1800s. Our program schedule began July 21st. We sign on the air at 6:30 AM and go off at the present at 7:30 PM.
