In appreciation of your response upon hearing our signal, we are only to glad to verify your report. Your report contains excerpts from our inaugural program, held the 16th. of October.

We went on our regular schedule the following day, from 6 a.m., to 5:15 p.m. . Our format is that of a Muse Station, similar to that of WNEW.

WEOK operates with 1000 watts on 1390 kes. as you heard, an is composed mainly of RCA equipment. Our antenna consists of a 200' guyed tower 200' above sea level, with a ground system containing 120 200' radials.

As yet we have not established any regular frequency check schedule, but will do so soon. We do make our checks with RCA Measurments at Riverhead Long Island.

We beleive we have broken all records as to the construction of a broadcast station. We had our studios ready and were installing our transmitter before our 20 day waiting period was up.

I hope that this report will meet with your satisfaction, and any other imformation you wish will be gladly forewarded upon application.
