Mr. Cooper;

Thank you for your letter of October 12th. This is to confirm your reception of the transmission of a frequency test, on October the 12th, from 2:10 to 2:25 A.M. E.D.T.

W G G O RADIO conducts frequency tests usually from 0200 to 0215A, on the second Monday morning of each month. We have recieved letters from as far away as New Zealand. Our transmitter operates with one kilowatt output power, non-directional daytime. Daylight time is observed in this state until the last of this month and also by this station.

Call letters were changed on March 1st, 1958 because of new ownership. W G G O RADIO is now owned and operated by the James Broadcasting Company who operate the stations that appear on the letter head. Sign on each morning is at 6 and on Sunday at 7 in the morning. W G G O RADIO has had on file with the F. C. C. an application for an increase in power to five kilowatts since the 24th of December, 1958.

Logging W G G O RADIO in the New England States and the Upper Middle Atlantic States is very easy. Reports are rarely recieved from the South, and from the Mid and far West, as well as Western Canada.
