Dear Mr. Cooper:

Our apologies for not having answered your nice letter of reception of WGLI during our test period on August 20th, 1958 on 1290 Kc.

We operate with a very "tight" pattern in order to protect co-channel stations. Along an east-south-easterly direction we project 4700 watts of power, which, of course, gives us a potent signal in the business and residential areas which we serve.

The rest of our pattern is covered by our WTFM station radiating 15,000 watts on 103.5 Mc.

At the present writing we are not fully staffed, but if and when the opportunity presents itself, we will be glad to run an early morning special DX Test for the National Radio Club.
