Dear Ernest:

Thank you for your kind letter of the 11th of December in which you say that you picked up our signal in Brooklyn. This letter will VERIFY your reception of WLSV at 790 KC between 2:25 and 2:52:30 on the 11th. Your identification of the programming during our tests was true and correct. WLSV began regular operation on October 31st, 1955 and is a daytime operation. We have not established a definite frequency check date or time as yet but will undoubtedly do so in the very near future. The program you intercepted was brought about by one of the small technical problems attendant upon the opening of a new station. While we were operating satisfactorily, it was felt that we could do "just a little better". We are non-directional with an antenna height of 272 feet overall above ground. Our tower is located in a wet valley, giving an excellent ground at all seasons of the year. We are independent and not affiliated with any networks. Ernest, could you publicize a test program in advance if we were to set one for about 4 A.M. some morning? How far does your NRC have membership? We would be happy to cooperate.
