WOLF thanks you for your comprehensive report of September 6th, 1940. This will verify your report of reception of our signal the evening of September 5th.

At the time we were heard at your receiving station we were using 100 watts power. That same day we received word from the F.C.C. that our application for 250 watts had been granted. A few days more should find us operating with the increased wattage.

We are not maintaining a regular schedule for frequency checks since no reliance can be placed on successful measurements through the QRM caused by the "all night" stations you mentioned. The daily schedule runs from 6:45 A.M. to 2:00 A.M. the next day.
