Dear Mr. Cooper:

This will confirm your reception report of
June 18th, 1962, from 2:26 A.M. to 2:28 A.M.

At the time we were conducting routine frequency response checks of our studio and transmitting equipment. WXXKW's frequency test period is the first Monday morning of each month at 12:20 EST.

A copy of our coverage map is not available at this time. We will keep your letter in our files and when reproductions of it are available, we will try to remember to send you one.

WXXKW operates a 500 watt Gates 500T transmitter into a 5/8th's wave antenna, non-directional pattern. This antenna should radiate a minimum of skywave, so we have been surprised to receive DX reports for every test broadcast we have conducted thus far. Some of the reports we have received so far have been from Milan, Michigan; Southport, Connecticut; Walpole, Massachusetts; Pointe Claire, Quebec, Canada; and Paterson, New Jersey.

WXXKW doesn't stand for anything at the moment, but it may stand for 10 kilowatts when our FM Adjunct commences operation later this year. We used it primarily for any residual promotional value the old call letters might carry with them.
