Dear Ernie:

Thank you for your nice letter report reception of WXYJ on December 10, 1962 from 4:00 to 4:14 AM. The program during that portion was 1000 cycle tone with station breaks every three minutes, as you reported. We received the report from Joseph Fela, Jr., also. We had two NRC members in the studios at the time of the program. Norm Pillsbury and Dick Kwiatkowski were both here and were on the program at various times. We are indebted to them, Norm in particular, for arranging this program and for help in preparing it, and for appearing on the program to explain the NRC to our other listeners who might not know about the club.

WXYJ operates on 1340 with 250 watts non-directional, fulltime. The antenna is a 150 foot self supported structure mounted on the roof of the WXYJ Building in downtown Jamestown. We go on the air at 5:30 AM daily, and 7:55 AM on Sundays. Sign-off time is 1:05 AM daily, and 12:05 AM Sundays. We do not have a regular frequency check schedule, but these are handled on a call basis.

It is rather unique that you should have four verifications from Jamestown, since there are only two stations here. We changed call letters from WJOC to WXYJ last August 10, 1961. This was done after the major portion of the station was purchased in August, 1961, by Taylorradio. They did this in order to denote the fact that it was a new organization, etc.

I want to thank you and the National Radio Club for making possible this program on WXYJ. We have a great number of reception reports, (about 35 at the present), and they are still coming in several per day. We are happy to work with your club on this program. Thanks again for everything, and for your report. Good luck to you and your club in the future. Thanks also for the DX News. Seasons greetings.
