Dear Mr. Cooper

This is to verify your reception report of Oct. 2, 1952. Our logs show your report to be correct.

The population of Hugo is approximately 5,900.

The city was named for Victor Hugo in 1910. Up until that time, the city was known as Tailholt.

KIHN first went on the air Oct. 23, 1948. We are on the air sixteen hours per day. (6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.) There is no use in staying on the air past 10:00 p.m. because here in Indian Territory, the sidewalks are rolled up and put under shelter about 9:30.

Incedentally, our regular frequency check is the first Thursday in each month. Yes, we check with Kansas City.

Enclosed is a shot gun coverage map-- a shot in the dark. It is a pretty close approximation of our coverage, in the daytime of course. You can imagine what 1340 is like in this part o f the woods at night. We are located in a low place here, its wet all the time, helps coverage a plenty.

Apologies for taking so long to answer, but we have been shorthanded for the last couple of months.

We're digging out from our first sno storm of the year--gotta couple of feet on the ground--our own that is-- melted so fast that it flooded.

We'll close this lengthy epistle with this final Word. Merry Christmas and a Happy, DXful New Year.
