This will verify the receipt of your reception report of December 17, 1950. We were glad to get your report and are happy to inform you that a check of our program logue of that date, shows that you were correct.

When you heard KWCO the first time, they were evidently just going on the air for the first time; very soon thereafter they were forced to forego night-time operation because of an injunction filed by WQXR. The former owners finally gave up the ghost, and my partner and I bought KWCO; after a year and a half, we finally succeeded in working out a directional pattern which would satisfy WQXR KPMC, and Cuba, so now we are Full Time-Clear Channel, and are on our regular schedule of 6 AM to 12 Mid-night CST. As soon as we get our coverage map completed, we will send you one. Our frequency check is made during our regular broadcast day.

I'm sending a sheet from a brochure on Chickasha, which will answer your questions. Give us another listen sometime; A Merry Christmas to you and yours.
