Thank you for your letter of congratulations. We are happy to hear that we are getting into Brooklyn even if the signal is low.


You are not the first "DXer" that we have heard from, but we are happy to tell you that your reception of our December 29th broadcast as outlined in your letter is hereby verified.

Our regular schedule runs from 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight with the exception of Sunday when we go on the air at 8:00 a.m. We are not in a position to run a "DX" program in the early morning at this time. If we are ever in a position to do so, I will let you know a month ahead of time as you suggest in your letter. We will, however, be broadcasting the 1st Friday of every month between 12:01 and 12:15 a.m. ~~EST~~ for a frequency check with RCA communications. The signal will consist of steady tone with call letter announcements at 3-minute intervals. This testing will commence January 4, 1958 at 12:01 a. m.

We can only presume that our signal goes into Lumberville, Pennsylvania since we have not heard from anyone in that town. We do know that the reception in New Hope is quite good.

Thanks again for your interest in our station and your kind remarks about it.
