I am writing, at this time, to say "many thanks" for your letter concerning your reception of our station in Brooklyn.

We are a fairly new radio station having going on the air on March 19, 1956.

We operate with 1000 watts power on A. M. 4700watts on F. M.

The A. M. station has a music and news format, the F. M. features good music and religious programs.

The tower you saw to the left of U. S. 11 was ours the other one was W C H A the other station here.

WE are non-directional, operate to sun down only.

WE sign on at 6:00 AM in the morning, 7:30 on Sunday.

We do not have an early morning frequency check as our monitoring service can pick us up with our regular programming.

Chambersburg has a population of 18,000, and was named after a Col. Ben Chambers.
