Dear Mr. Cooper:

Thanks very much for your letter of above date. We are greatly surprised that WEEEX signal has been received at such a distance.

We have checked the program logs for Sunday, May 27, 1956 and the selections and newscasts broadcasts agree exactly with the time and selections listed in your letter.

Easton is a community of 78,000. The struggle for the 1230 facility began in 1945 when WEEEX was one of four applicants. After the hearing, the facility was awarded to WHOL, Allentown. WEEEX appealed to the District Court of Appeals, Washington, D. C. which remanded the case to the FCC for another hearing. The trial examiner at the second hearing decided in favor of WHOL but was reversed by the FCC which awarded the frequency to WEEEX. WHOL then entered an appeal with the District Court of Appeals which decided in its favor after which the FCC carried the case to the U.S. Supreme Court which found that the lower court had erred in questions of fact and questions of law.

The District Court of Appeals then reversed itself on December last and subsequently refused to rehear the case, so after 10 years of litigation WEEEX-AM finally went on the air on May 10th.
