Please accept this letter as a verification of your DX Report dated March 10th. We are deeply gratified and very pleased to receive any such reports.

The reception you recorded was of course, our scheduled frequency check transmission. In answer to your queries, it is our regularly scheduled transmission check period. It occurs on the second Thursday of each month between 5:45 and 6:00 AM E.S.T., or in the summer-time between 6:45 and 6:59:30 AM E.D.S.T., whichever is the time you go by then. Also, we are checked by RCA, I believe there Frequency Measuring Laboratory is located at Riverhead, New York.

At the present time we sign on the air at 7:00 AM and sign off at midnight. On Sundays, we sign on at 8:00 AM. Our affiliation is with the Mutual Broadcasting System.

Our transmitter, associated broadcast, and studio equipment is mainly RCA. The transmitter is Type BTA-1L.

Our output at night is directionalized and we use a four tower array for this operation although our power remains the same, 1000 watts continuously.

Again let me express our thanks for your DX Report. We will keep it in our files for future reference.
