This is to verify and to thank you for submitting your report confirming reception of our signal in your territory.

We are a daytime station. Our sign-on time during the week is 6:30 a.m. EDST, while on Sundays it is 8:00 a.m. Our sign-off time is 7:30 p.m.

Our frequency checks are made at State College during the broadcast day, so you can see that our signal has little chance of being heard by DXers.

WKVA reaches seven surrounding counties. Lewistown has a population of approximately 14,000 and was named for its founder, Mr. William Lewis, who was known as the "Iron Merchant".

You asked about Bernie Bopp. Yes, he is still Chief at our local competition.

We are grateful for the trouble you have taken to post us with respect to the reception of our signal in your area, and we thank you again for submitting it.
