Thank you for your report on reception of Radio Station WNPV.

This will verify your reception of our station on Oct. 14, 1960


at 2.15am.

WNPV, Lansdale, Penna., transmits on 1440 KC with a power of 500 watts. The radiating system is directional and consists of two towers each 175 feet tall. The normal broadcast day is sunrise to sunset weekdays, with sign on at 8:00 a.m. on Sundays.

WNPV began regular broadcasting on October 17, 1960. The complete facility, studios, transmitter, and offices are housed in one building on a 12 acre plot approximately 1 1/2 miles west of the center of Lansdale.
