Dear Ernie;

Sorry to be so long in getting an answer to you to verify the reception of WHTT. I have had in my possession a letter from you on Oct. 15, 1961. Your letter did not contain a return address, hence, I could not reply. I have just received a letter dated Feb. 6, 1962, that had been mis-filed.

The reception you made during last Oct. was made during the time we were making field intensity measurements and conducting program tests to check out audio systems, etc., In checking out the program log 2-6-62 you were accurate on the broadcast at 3.40 p.m. As for the broadcast on Oct. 12, 1961 all I can verify is that music was being played with a station announcement as to frequency, call sign, FCC permit number, power rating, and location. I assume that you were accurate on what the selections may have been as the rest is ok.

We are on a frequency of 1300 kc., at 1000 watts using a Collins 20V2 Transmitter into a Collins Phaser into a directive array consisting of two two hundred foot towers fed 60 degrees out of phase. We are located 1.6 miles SE of Hazleton, Penna. Our operating time is strictly daylight hours. As for early morning frequency checks we have one a month at 12:30 a.m. on the ~~last Wednesday~~ fourth Wednesday of the month.

I am inclosing one of our coverage maps and do hope that this letter will serve a verification of reception.

Should any other information be needed I can assure you that it will not be delayed as this was. We are now over our growing pains and do have some semblence of order.
