Many thanks for your reception report of Dec 24, 1962. Your report is hereby confirmed.

During the Christmast holidays, WISA remained on the air 24 hours a day to accomadate all of our listeners; however, normally, we sign off at 2300 (AST). We sign on at 0600 (AST). During the day, we run 1000 watts and after sundown, we are on half power till sign-off. We use a Collins 20V3 transmitter to an antenna 186' tall (non-directional). When you heard us, we were at 1000 watts, ase we are allowed to use daytime power from 4 am on.

We do not have coverage maps of our territory, however, our signal area ranges from Arecibo to Mayaguez and we do "air feed" WRJS in San German, near Ponce. We are not heard in San Juan or the eastern part of the island as WHOA (1400) in San Juan gives us trouble in that area.

Regarding your suggestion of special programming for your club. That is a matter you had best take up with Mr. Raul Santiago-Roman, our manager. Perhaps you could write him a letter directly and inquire about it.

The voice you heard in English was mine, and the voice in Spanish was that of Mr. Padin, one of our fine staff announcers.
