

Dear Mr. Cooper:

Greetings from the island of Vieques and station WIVV, the West Indies Voice of Vieques.

Thank you for your fine letter of March 7. We appreciate your response to our special DX program of February 26, 1957. This letter is to verify your reception of our station. We are sorry that the weather didn't cooperate a little better that morning. However, we hope that you enjoyed the broadcast.

We broadcast 17 hours a day, beginning at 6:00 a.m. AST. 15 hours of our broadcasting is in English and 2 hours in Spanish. Our initial broadcast was December 8, 1956.

We make our frequency checks on the second Tuesday of the month with R.C.A. Monitoring Station in New York City.

On survey, we find our greatest listening audience is in the Virgin Islands with a total population of $1\frac{1}{2}$ million, most of which are English speaking people. Our signal is heard regularly and all day by audiences nearly one thousand miles away. We receive letters from Trinidad regularly. We are very happy about this.

Thank you again for your report and write again when you have the time.
