Congradulations!

This is to QXL your reception report of our 630 frequency on October 10th. Yours is now the third letter from that general area with a "DX" report. I'm sure that Ron told you almost all the details that one could know about WKW.

Your report was correct except in a very few minor details. It looks like static was interfering and you made a few guesses as to some of the words. 90% of what you had was correct and you certainly were receiving WKY.

I have checked into the possibility of a "DX" program at the time you mentioned. I think that we'll have to wait till next summer when we drop down to about 5:45AM (A.S.T.) for our sign-on. Because of the fact we are a directional station at night we would have to have an engineer at the transmitter for that brief program on the directional operation before going non-directional. If you find out that Sam Juan is being threatened by a hurricane you might try listening in the early A.M. as we generally stay on the air until we get an all-clear. This happened during hurricane Flora.

Radio W-UNO you might get very late at night as they are a twenty-four gour operation. They play a great deal of American Rock 'n Roll records so don't confuse them with an American station. They sound like WABC but in Spanish. By the way, WABC as well as WINS often put a "Good" signal into San Juan. I belive I heard WLIB and WMCA the other night too. Both of their signals were poor with a great deal of fadeing.
