I received your letter reporting reception of WHWB, and am pleased to send you this letter of verification. All the information concerning items and announcements on WHWB from 5:10:45 to 5:15 on October 25, 1950, was stated correctly in your letter.

WHWB operates, as you correctly stated, on 1000 kilocycles with a power of 1000 watts. We are a non-directional daytime station; our transmitter is a Raytheon model RA-1000 (new) located 1.6 miles northwest of the city of Rutland; our tower is a 259 foot self-supporting Lehigh (new).

You may be interested in knowing that we received two other letters during the week you wrote, stating that they received us during the same period of time. One was in New Jersey; the other was in Arlington, Virginia.

I am retaining your reception report in our files. If you would like additional information on the station, please let me know.
