
I happened to be on the Sunday night you heard us and you came fairly close to the phonetics of my name.

We employ a guyed 166 foot verticle antenna located in a fairly damp area which supplies us with a very good ground. We have a Collin's 250 watt xmitter which we are very satisfied with. We are not still in a trailer, that lasted about three months.

Brattleboro is a town of approximately 12,000 people. Of course our coverage map will explain almost any question you can ask about this area.

Our next early morning checking period is at 0103 the 2nd of November. We use a 1,000 cycle tone.
