Dear Mr. Cooper:

This will verify the receipt and the correctness of your report of reception of KPUY, on the morning of January 4, 1953. I am happy to advise that we received reports from twenty three states, and four provinces of Canada. A total of fifty six reports were received and all have been verified. Everyone reporting was a member of the National Radio Club.

KPUY went on the air on December 6, 1951, with 100 watts and our power was increased to 250 watts on December 9, 1952. We are affiliated with the "Baseball Network" a network of thirteen stations which carry all the games of the Seattle Rainiers, of the Pacific Coast League.

Our regular frequency check is on the third Friday of each month, from 1:00 to 2:00 A.M. Pacific Standard Time.

Puyallup is a town of slightly over 11,000 population, located in the heart of the "Puyallup Valley" the bulb and berry center of the world. More tulips are grown in the Puyallup valley than in Holland. It is also the cite of the "Daffodil Festival" one of the largest flower festivals and parades in the world. Every float is entirely covered with golden daffodil blossoms. It is also the home of the Puyallup Fair which attracts upwards of 250,000 paid attendants every year.

Puyallup is an Indian word, meaning "Friendly People," and it is situated on the banks of the Puyallup River, just six miles east of Tacoma. Majestic, snow-covered Mt. Ranier stands as a sentinel, overlooking the town and valley. More than half million people pass through Puyallup each year, on their way to or from Ranier Park.
