Dear Mr. Cooper:

Thank you for your letter of November 13 describing reception of Radio Station WCHF on November 12. Your log of our program checks closely with the program log and therefore, this letter serves as a verification of your report.

Radio Station WCHF started its regular broadcast schedule November 18, 1954 with 1000 watts of power on 1150 KC daytime. Most of our equipment is Gates and our studios are located in the heart of downtown Chippewa Falls. The transmitter is located approximately one-half mile north of the city limits of Chippewa Falls. The transmitting equipment is run by remote control from the studio site and our antenna is a 220 foot guide tower located in a marshy area.

This station is one of four in the Flambeau Network which is owned and operated by the M&N Broadcasting Co. The other three stations are 250 watt stations located in Medford, Park Falls, and Ladysmith.

Thank you again for your report on our preliminary broadcast and on behalf of the management and staff of WCHF we wish you continued good luck with your DXing.
