This is the first time WEKZ has put on such a program and so far the reports have come in from 23 states and parts of Canada. We have received reports from California, Washington, Texas, and the east coast.


WEKZ first went on the air August 28, 1951. Our transmitter and studios are located 2 miles east of Monroe. Monroe is a typical Swiss community and the main industry is dairy farming. The pop. is about 8000. According to our Women's Director, Dorthy Kundert, who is something of an historian, says that Monroe was named after the president of the same name.

We have no early morning frequency checks as they are made late in the mornings when we put a good signal into the Bell Tel. labs at Lake Bluff, Ill. near Chicago. Our regular hours of operation are 0530 each morning untill local sunset, CST. It might be possible that during the wintertime you could hear some of our regular broadcasts as + have received reports from you neck of the woods. Of course it would depend alot on what some of the other stations are doing at that time and of course on conditions.

I am sending under sepearate cover one of our albums and a rather poor map of our coverage.
