Dear Mr. Cooper;

This is to verify your reception report on WOSA (formerly WLIN) on February 12, 1953. WOSA has a regularly scheduled frequency monitoring program the second Thursday of every month from 1:15 AM to 1:30 AM, C.S.T..

WOSA and WLIN (now our FM affiliate) uses all Collins equipment. Presently we operate non-directional day and directional at night with a four tower array. WOSA has a CP to build a 5 kw station in Wausau, Wis., directional 2 towers day and directional 6 towers night. WLIN, our FM station, will stay here in Merrill. Merrill has population of about 8800 and Wausau a population of about 30,000 which is 17 miles south of Merrill. We were on a non-directional pattern for our frequency check. We started to use the WOSA call on 1-29-53. The WOSA call was taken so that it would somewhat resemble Wausau for when we get the new installation going down there, This we hope to be some time in April. I hope this answers all of your questions. Sorry we do not have any spare coverage maps at present.

Thank you for your reception report and that WOSA may be added to the list of DX reports you have had verified in the past.
