Dear Mr. Cooper:

I wish to thank you for the fine report you gave on our equipment test on Saturday August 28th, 1948 from 1:30 to 1:45 AM CST, and to confirm that we were broadcasting at that time and that your log was correct.

The station here uses Raytheon equipment throughout with a quarter wave antenna series fed, with 120 radials 240 feet long. We will be operating daytime only from 6:30 AM to local sunset which is 6:15 PM this month and 4:30 PM for November. We will operate on this schedule 7 days a week. We do not anticipate any network affiliation for a while.

Was really surprised at the reports that we received from these broadcasts. We got most of them from the east coast, which would be true because of the time zones. A listener in Seattle won the cash prize we offered.

We received four other letters from members of the National Radio Club: they were Mrs. Clara Wachtel in Cedar Rapids, Iowa - Len Kruse, Dubuque, Iowa - Howard G. Kemp in Waterbury, Conn. - and Eldon E. Addy Marcus, Iowa. They all gave very thorough reports and wish to congratulate your club on the fine work you are doing.
