Thanks very much for your letter of July 1. It sounds as if you indeed had WQPR tuned in at 88.7. I find it a bit odd that you were able to pick up our lower powered translator for our main signal WUAL which is at 91.5. WQPR operates out of the Muscle Shoals, AL area in the northwest corner of our state and operates on about 25,000 watts. WUAL covers Tuscaloosa and Birmingham with 100,000 watts and both stations are programmed out of Tuscaloosa at the University of Alabama.

The program you were listening to was "Weekend Edition" from National Public Radio. Of the four breaks that you heard three of the four were from our station. The 8:26 weather break was not our station (our weather break would have occurred at 8:19 am C.D.T. and is not underwritten).

When I was growing up I used to listen to all the distant AM signals I could receive on my parent's radio, so I know what a wonderful hobby distant listening can be. It also sounds as if your program on WOMR is also a lot fun to do. Good luck with your radio and associated endeavors and peace to you as well. I am enclosing copies of the WUAL and WQPR coverage maps as well as a copy of our program guide. As of this fall we will have a new translator on the air out of Selma, AL that will also cover Montgomery. It will be at 88.3 MHz. Thanks again for your letter and the best of luck to you.
