Dear Mr. Cooper:

We have recently received your report of reception of WFSU-FM on June 19, 1990, at 6:29:15 PM E.D.T., and after comparing your report with our logs, I am very happy to confirm reception. You heard our station break just before we joined "Fresh Air", a National Public Radio program aired by many stations.

WFSU-FM is operated by The Florida State University, with studios located on the campus in Tallahassee, and transmitter located near Bloxham, Florida, about 18 miles west of Tallahassee. We broadcast 24 hours daily with an effective radiated power of 50,000 watts from an antenna 500 feet above average terrain on the frequency of 91.5 MHz. Our transmitter is an RCA BTF-20E1, and our antenna is a circularly polarized 6 bay RCA BFC-6B.

We appreciate hearing from you and invite you to stop in for a visit should you ever be in the area.
